Important Reminders

- Each member of the audience may participate in Open Forum. Participation is limited to 3 minutes per individual. Board Supervisors may ‘sponsor’ a topic from Open Forum and add it to the New Business portion of next month’s agenda.

If the disruptive individual does not leave, the Pine County Sheriff’s Office will be called to have a deputy sent to Town Hall.
